Kathy Rexanne Davis, 72, of Rocklin California tragically passed on October 2, 2022. She and her husband were out on their morning walk, and a vehicle quickly took her life.

Kathy was born in Seattle, Washington to Rex and Bernice Middleton on November 3, 1949. Two short years later, her father was killed in the Korean War. Kathy was then raised by her mother and step father Lloyd Anderson. Kathy's lifelong love of the outdoors began with her family; camping, hiking, picking huckleberries, and fishing in the Pacific Northwest. She graduated from Rainier Beach High School in 1968 and later from Whitworth University in Spokane Washington with a BA in Fine Arts.

During college, Kathy traveled the world spending time in Europe, Asia, Africa, and South America. She met her husband Jim while working as a flight attendant for Trans International Airlines. They married in 1980. Together, Kathy and Jim raised a family while traveling and growing their love of the outdoors. Kathy spent many years as a contractor for the Department of Defense and the State of California.

Kathy's greatest passions in life were cooking, travel, and her family. Her love of cooking was passed on from her mother Bernice and now to her children and grandchildren. The family feels very blessed to have the two cookbooks

she wrote full of her most special recipes. Her family was her greatest love.

Kathy leaves behind her husband Jim; children Chris (Claire) Davis, Kimberly (Ernesto) Bragado, and stepson Paul (Tara) McIntyre; and siblings Cindy and Brian along with many in-laws, nieces, and nephews. Also blessed to have shared her life are her 5 grandchildren: Malaya, Jayden, Saige, William, and Benjamin. Kathy is preceded in death by her parents, stepfather, and son Shawn.
