



Robert Thomas Scafe

Robert Thomas Scafe passed away on Tuesday, July 2, 2024, at his home in Lincoln, California at the age of 80, just short of his 81st birthday. He was born on July 5th, 1943, in Flint Michigan to the late Robert Thomas Scafe Sr. and Alice Blanche Whetham Scafe. Rob leaves behind his loving wife Gail Scafe, daughters Jennifer Newby (Sean) of Pensacola Florida and Elizabeth Scafe of Calgary Canada, sister Susan Kimball Lawrence (Ted) of Grand Blanc Michigan, brother John Scafe (Pam) of Byron Center Michigan, and two granddaughters.

Rob graduated from Flushing High School in 1961, and worked in local jobs until he enlisted in the Navy where he served from 1964-1970, part of which time was on the USS Jouett. Rob had a lifelong love of fishing and golf, traveling to National Parks, and playing cribbage. He was a member of several local fishing clubs, as well as California Fly Fishers Unlimited. Rob became a talented fly tyer and achieved the Bronze and Silver levels from Fly Fishers International and was working towards the Gold.

Rob was a man who loved life and valued his friendships and family. He was

known for his sense of humor and his pursuit of fun. He was a well-loved man and will be greatly missed by all who knew him. Rob will be interred at the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery for Veterans in Dixon, CA.
